Significant Accomplishments

Research

Faculty and residents within the Division of Pediatric Dentistry have published five papers in peer-reviewed journals; some also have published or are working on textbook chapters. Another three articles have been submitted with one recently accepted for publication. We also have submitted two HRSA grant requests. Finally, Stephen Wilson, DMD, MA, PhD, was invited to make presentations on sedation at conferences in Australia, Boston, and Florida.

Clinical

The Division has utilized an electronic patient management system, called Axium, since 2007. The system has proven very beneficial to the Division, providing a host of customizable and informative reports. The system is due this year for a software upgrade.

Building upon developments from our annual retreat, we have established a Dentistry tab on Centerlink (viewable only by employees, residents, and faculty) that allows us to post updates, policies, procedures, links, photos, and the like. We believe progress in this area will strengthen teamwork within our Division and eventually lead to better quality care and safer practices.

Unfortunately, poor economic conditions prompted the closure of two of the Division's three satellite offices (Mason and Anderson) leaving the Fairfield office open. While this has been a difficult transition, we are poised and prepared for opportunities for future growth.

Education

This year, our 2nd year residents presented several posters at our Academy's annual session. Our residents continue to pass the written and oral portions of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry. They also continue to perform above average individually and collectively on the "exit" examination, a written test taken by all residents/graduate students of advanced pediatric dentistry training programs across the nation.
