Significant Accomplishments

No infants born with HIV in 8 years

The Family Care Center, led by Corinne ("Corki") Lehmann, MD, MEd, provides healthcare and follow-up testing of infants, children, adolescents, and young adults exposed to or infected by HIV. The team includes nursing, social work, physician, and community case management services through Caracole. The center works closely with the HIV Perinatal Collaborative, which includes physicians, nurses and social workers from Infectious Disease, Gynecology/Obstetrics, and Pediatrics. Through the work of the Perinatal Collaborative, no infant has been born infected with HIV in the last eight years in the Greater Cincinnati area. The Family Care Center evaluates around 24 infants per year and has an ongoing caseload of 40 patients.

Eating Disorders Program also supports siblings

The Eating Disorder Program, directed by Laurie Mitan, MD, has expanded its clinical and research endeavors to include support for siblings living in a family affected by eating disorders. Funded by a generous anonymous philanthropic gift, the program was able to recruit Abigail Johnson, PhD, to lead this expansion. In addition, using the division's Change the Outcome funds, the Eating Disorder Program has started an eating disorder treatment track for post-doctoral fellows in collaboration with the Division of Behavioral Medicine and Clinical Psychology.

Preventing sexually transmitted infections

Jessica Kahn, MD, MPH, Tanya Mullins, MD, and Lea Widdice, MD, conduct collaborative, international

research to prevent sexually transmitted infections (STIs) in adolescents using emerging technologies and interventions, and to decrease racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic disparities in the incidence of STIs and their clinical consequences. Kahn examines the epidemiology and risk factors for HPV infection in adolescents; the influence of HPV vaccination on sexual attitudes and behaviors; the impact of HPV vaccination on the epidemiology of HPV in the community; and the safety and effectiveness of HPV vaccination in HIV-infected youth. Mullins studies the epidemiology of STIs among HIV-infected and HIV-uninfected youth, as well as clinician attitudes and intentions toward prescribing new biomedical HIV prevention methods, the results of which will inform the dissemination of such methods and thus improve adolescent access to effective HIV prevention strategies. Widdice combines epidemiological, behavioral, and health services research methods, and focuses on HPV natural history; uptake, use, and impact of point-of-care STI diagnostic devices in clinical and community settings; and development of clinical interventions to increase HPV vaccination and STI testing and treatment.

This study examined interventions that focused on evidence-based care, self-management, and enhanced management of those with poorly controlled asthma. Those receiving the evidence-based care bundle and self-management bundle experienced a sustained increase in asthma control as well as increased confidence in their ability to manage their/their child's asthma.

This study longitudinally examined girls participating in the Breast Cancer and the Environment Research Centers. White participants matured significantly earlier than white participants in the 1997 study Pediatric Research in Office Settings (PROS), but not as early as black participants. The single major factor accounting for earlier maturation in all participants was body mass index (BMI), which was a more significant contributor than race or ethnicity.

Prophylactic HPV vaccination has the potential to dramatically reduce morbidity and mortality due to cervical cancer and other anogenital and oropharyngeal cancers, but vaccine clinical trials did not examine the immune response to vaccination in immunocompromised populations. This was the first study to examine the immune response to vaccination in HIV-infected young women, and demonstrated that immune titers and seroconversion rates were very high, especially among young women on anti-retroviral therapy.

Although communication with a healthcare provider is an important factor in parental decision making about HPV vaccination, little is known about the perspectives of 11-12 year-old girls, parents, and clinicians with respect to communication about the HPV vaccine. We found that vaccine efficacy and safety were important topics for clinicians to address with girls and mothers during vaccination visits and that girls may be missing important vaccine-related messages related to sexual health, suggesting that clinicians should encourage girls

to be active participants in discussions about the HPV vaccine.
