



Circumcision Clinic

Most of the time, circumcisions on newborns are performed within days of birth by obstetricians before mother and infant leave the birthing hospital. However an infant may not be a candidate for circumcision so quickly after birth due to an acute health care problem, prematurity, or an anatomical issue requiring evaluation by a pediatric urologist.

In such cases, our outpatient circumcision clinics provide a way for those families to have their infant sons circumcised later, shortly after birth.

Our treatment approach

We conduct an initial consult visit for any family referred to us to evaluate the infant's health and suitability for circumcision. Infants cleared for the procedure are then scheduled for circumcision in our outpatient clinic.

Our goal is to keep the infant as comfortable as possible throughout the procedure, using local anesthesia during circumcision.
