

Who are the Liberty Campus Social Workers?

Our social workers all have Master's degrees in Social Work, and are Licensed Independent Social Workers. We have varied backgrounds and experience, including: crisis intervention, emergency psychiatric services, child welfare, domestic violence, community mental health, public health clinics, and school-based services.

What do we do?

Assessments and intervention in the Liberty Campus Emergency Department:

Psychiatric/mental health

A thorough psychiatric assessment is completed with patients present with mental health crisis:

- Assess patient's mental health needs and determine their potential risk to self and others
- Make a recommendation of the appropriate level of care for the patient

Physical and sexual abuse

Collaboration with the medical team in evaluation of alleged abuse:

- Social worker gathers information and history from care provider and child
- Physical exam is completed by doctor
- If abuse is suspected, social worker collaborates with Children's Services and to police

Trauma

Respond to all traumas in the emergency department:

- Provide primary support to families in crisis situation
- Help to meet needs of family members while child is being stabilized

Social service and mental health consultations for all areas of Liberty Campus: Provide intervention, support, and connection with resources to families in inpatient unit, clinics, and same-day surgery.
