The Fellowship

The ACGME-accredited Adolescent Medicine Fellowship program at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center prepares fellows for successful careers that will improve the health and well-being of adolescents and young adults nationally and globally.

The Division trains fellows in a respectful, educational environment to become national and international leaders in academic medicine, public health, education, and biomedical, behavioral, and health services research.

Research Training

Cincinnati Children's ranks third in the nation in federal funding from the National Institutes of Health compared with all other pediatric institutions in the United States.

Previous areas of research pursued by fellows have included public health, community program evaluation, medical education, and healthcare quality improvement. Recent topics have included puberty, obesity, eating disorders, depression, asthma, contraception, HIV, syphilis, and healthcare delivery to transgender youth and adolescents in medical homes.

Additional Training Opportunities

Fellows can choose to gain additional training through established Masters programs in Public Health, Clinical and Translational Research, Medical Education, Business Administration, or Quality Improvement in Health Care Delivery.

Educational Goals


Fellows work closely with their mentors to develop an educational plan that will best prepare them for their chosen career path.

Fellows complete rotations in Adolescent Medicine clinics, psychiatry, gynecology, and Juvenile Justice. Additional training is available in focused areas such as endocrinology, sports medicine, and HIV medicine.

The Division has a long history of advocacy work. Fellows may work with accomplished faculty for advocacy experience with local communities; educational and judicial systems; and county, state, national, and international governments.


