COURSE DESCRIPTION

This intermediate level three day workshop is designed for physical therapists, physical therapy assistants, occupational therapists, occupational therapy assistants and speech-language pathologists working with infants and children from birth- 4 years of age who have known or suspected neuro-motor disorders including cerebral palsy. Lecture material will cover treatment concepts based on Neuro-Developmental Treatment and current theories of motor control and motor development, typical and atypical motor development, and principles of assessment and treatment planning. Family issues and home carryover will also be discussed. Therapeutic handling strategies/ techniques will be demonstrated through lab experience and patient demonstration.



COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this three -day workshop participants will be able to:

- Identify significant aspects of typical/atypical motor development in the first year of life
- Discuss current motor control/motor learning concepts that support NDT intervention with infants and young children
- Utilize information presented on assessment and planning of treatment with patients
- Integrate handling strategies/techniques learned in lab into daily practice

COURSE INSTRUCTOR

Linda A. Kliebhan, PT, is a physical therapist in private practice in Mequon, Wisconsin with over 30 years experience in pediatrics treating children with cerebral palsy and other neuro-motor disorders. Ms. Kliebhan is a Neuro-Developmental Treatment (NDT) Coordinator-Instructor teaching the NDT/Bobath Course in the Treatment and Management of Children with Cerebral Palsy, advanced NDT courses and other workshops related to NDT and pediatric therapy. She is co-founder of Partners for Progress Inc., a non-profit organization providing and researching intensive therapy, and is also a consultant to the Medical College of Wisconsin Department of Orthopaedics.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Participants are required to have the book *Approach to Treatment of the Baby* by Regi Boehme, OTR. Copies of this book will be available for purchase at the workshop for approximately \$40. Participants also will need to bring a soft-body doll 24"-36" long such as a Raggedy Ann.
