Purpose

The Continuing Medical Education (CME) program of Cincinnati Children's reflects the institution's mission of improving child health and transforming delivery of care through fully integrated globally recognized research, education and innovation. For patients from our community, the nation and the world, the education we provide will help the institution achieve the best medical and quality of life outcomes, patient and family experience and value today and in the future.

Content

Cincinnati Children's CME program utilizes the ACGME core competencies and the performance-based privileging measures of the medical staff. The content areas of our CME activities include medical/clinical knowledge, systems-based practice, practice-based learning and improvement, interpersonal/communication skills, and professionalism. With these core competencies as a guiding principle, content is developed based on the needs of our physician audience and frequently includes but is not limited to 1) the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of disease, including clinical judgment and clinical and technical skills, 2) quality improvement science, 3) safe patient care, 4) medical professionalism and ethics, and 5) clinical research.

Target Audience

Cincinnati Children's CME target audience primarily consists of physicians as well as other healthcare professionals who treat children as part of their practice; however, where appropriate, the CME program helps address the needs of all health care providers.

Type of Activity

Cincinnati Children's CME activities and services provided include, but are not limited to organizing, promoting, and presenting CME via a variety of formats (lectures, conferences, symposiums, and enduring materials) and tracking participant attendance.

Expected Results

Cincinnati Children's CME program provides activities with the expectation that knowledge and clinical skills of all participants will be advanced and enhanced, leading to improvements in physician competence, performance, and patient outcomes.
