# The Cincinnati Breast Cancer and the Environment Research Program (BCERP) is

a joint effort of researchers from the University of Cincinnati and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center with local breast cancer advocates and their community, support, and service organizations. We are working together on two projects.

In Growing Up Female (GUF), we are using epidemiology research methods to study how environmental and genetic factors impact the start of puberty and other potential milestones in young women.

In the Community Outreach and Translation Core (COTC), we are working toward best practices for educating breast cancer advocates, study participants, the general public, and policy makers about the research findings and their implications for personal health and public health policies.

"Looking Upstream for Environmental Links to Breast Cancer" is your opportunity to hear firsthand about research findings of the Cincinnati BCERP and national leaders.

During the course of our research, we have gathered interesting and important data that we are excited to share with our community.


