

The goal of using the cards is to facilitate a conversation.

1. Sit in close proximity to the parent and patient.



2. Show them the topics on each card.




3. Let them choose a card to discuss.



4. Allow them to read the card.




5. Explain what the information means.



6. Allow them to review all the cards & help select topics important to the family.



7. Select medicine that fits patient & family needs.



8. Give pamphlet for home reference & conclude visit.
