 - This website has information on medicine and healthcare assistance programs.
 - You can search by medication, diagnosis, government programs, and discount drug cards.
- Partnership for Prescription Assistance

 - This resource may be able to help you find the right program for your situation, free of charge.
 - Have your list of medications ready when you call.
- Together Rx Access

 - For legal US residents with NO prescription coverage.
 - A free prescription savings program for eligible individuals and families who lack prescription drug coverage and are not eligible for Medicare.
- Ohio's Best RX
 - 1-866-923-7879 (1-866-9BESTRX), www.ohiobestrx.org
 - A prescription drug discount program only for Ohio residents without prescription coverage who meet income guidelines
 - 1 page application, no fee
 - Can be used for Medicaid spend-down
- Rx Hope
 - 1-877-267-0517, www.rxhope.com
 - Search by medication, assistance program, or pharmaceutical company
- Pharmacies often offer discount programs, especially for generic drugs. Check with your local pharmacies.
- Contact the drug manufacture(s) to ask about possible assistance programs specific to each medication.
