Construction Family Builds Success at Cincinnati Children's

One project at a time, Chris Packer has built a successful family business. The Northern Avenue garage is his 4th construction project for Cincinnati Children's.

Packer, the owner of Rod-Techs construction, says working on the 14-story T building was a milestone for his family business, started by his Dad Larry in 2000.

Messer Construction has partnered with Cincinnati Children's on many construction projects over the years and both share a commitment to diversity and inclusion. Messer invited Rod-Techs to be a subcontractor on the T building in it's early stages.

Messer "took us under their wings," Packer says. "It was marvelous."

Since that first project, Rod-Techs has helped build the Proton Therapy Center at the Cincinnati Children's Liberty Campus, and is now working on the MRI expansion there, as well as the Northern Avenue garage expansion in Avondale.

Not only has this work been a boon for Packer's company. It has also

been deeply gratifying because of his personal connection to the hospital.

"My daughter has been a patient since birth and still comes to the hospital for consults," Packer says. "I've been at Cincinnati Children's (as a patient/family) for 23 years. When I was working on the T building it made for a quick trip in to see the doctor."

Now, walking on campus and seeing that his work is contributing to the hospital's development plan is "totally awesome!"

Healthcare Career Connections and Training

Cincinnati Children's and the Greater Cincinnati Urban League are teaming up to offer free employment training for jobs in healthcare.

On March 19, participants graduated with a training certificate and the chance to interview for a healthcare position.

The Career Insights program prepares participants to apply for jobs currently available at Cincinnati Children's as emergency services representatives, health unit coordinators, patient escorts and patient care assistants. The majority of graduates have been invited to complete next steps in the interview process.

The Career Insights training program was hosted at the Urban League in Avondale for four Saturdays in March. Topics covered:

- Culture, professionalism and diversity in healthcare
- · Ethical behavior and confidentiality
- Customer service and effective communication
- Introduction to medical terminology
- Resume preparation
- Mock interviews

The program included an on site visit to Cincinnati Children's with a tour of the Emergency Department, Urgent Care and Inpatient units.
