Fellows have the opportunity to participate in a variety of conference and other learning forums:

1) Fellows' Conference:

Fellow's conferences will occur weekly. Conferences are topics required for board review and enhance their experiences in clinic and the community setting. Presentations should last approximately 30 minutes and include an update of the literature and time to discuss controversial issues related to the topic. Conferences are given by both faculty and fellows, with each fellow expected to provide 6-8 lectures throughout the course of the year.

2) Journal Club:

Journal club has evolved to a city-wide session where each fellowship program sponsors one of the quarterly sessions. The goal of journal club is develop the skills to be able to critically analyze the medical literature for its quality, strength of evidence, and impact on practice. Topics are chosen by fellows with Program Director approval, and are themed for the appropriate season when possible.

3) Morbidity & Mortality:

The fellows will participate in this quarterly faculty development initiative. Cases, near misses, side effects, or potential harms are discussed that may be encountered in our practice.

4) Case Conference:

The fellows will participate in this quarterly faculty development conference. Cases from various providers will be reviewed and discussed as to management, documentation, etc.

5) Board Review Conference:

Starting during the second ½ of the year, faculty and fellows will be invited to participate in these board preparation seminars. The seminar will consist of answering board style question with discussion by the participants. Other formats may be substituted as desired.

6) Musculoskeletal US Conference:

Faculty, staff, and fellows will be invited to participate in 1-2 monthly didactic and hands on scanning sessions. Reading assignments and videos are used to prepare for these

sessions. Sessions will focus on the AMSSM curriculum and will focus on each joint approximately 1 per month.

7) Research Conference:

These short, biweekly sessions are designed to allow fellows to present their current state of their projects and allow for discussion of any stumbling blocks or issues. The fellow is responsible for driving the project forward and selecting their research team.

8) Introduction Workshops:

Introduction workshops will be held during the first 1-2 months of the fellowship. Topics will focus on exam, presentation, and academic skills needed to have a successful fellowship year. Additional session may be added as needed to address learning areas.

9) Orthopedics/Radiology Conference/Ortho Lecture Series:

Fellows are encouraged to attend the quarterly clinical correlation/radiology conference pending their rotation assignment.

10) Ortho Lecture Series

Fellows are invited to attend the daily orthopedic lecture series pending on an optional basis, pending their rotation schedule and topic for discussion. These conferences are hosted by the Orthopaedics department.

11) Education Committee:

Fellows are required to participate in the Division's Education committee. The purpose of the committee is to organize, discuss the educational needs of the entire division. Fellows are encouraged to take an active role in discussion and problem solving for this quarterly meeting.

12) Other: Institution Sponsored Conferences:

Fellows are encouraged to attend the

a) **CCHMC Fellows' Conference** – this occurs the 1st and 2nd Tues of the month in the Sabin Education Center from 12-1 pm. Required topics will be considered part of the research curriculum.

- b) **Pediatric Grand Rounds -** occurs on Tuesday mornings from 8-9 a.m, fellows are ecouranged to attend topics of interest
- c) **Pediatric Noon Conference -** offers and additional review of pediatrics. These occur on a daily basis and are geared toward the residents
- d) "Cross-Talk" research and clinical conferences occur the 3rd and 4th Tues of the month from 12-1 in the Sabin Education Center.
- e) **UC Health Sciences Library** offers a host of education sessions on various topics. Key workshops will be incorporated into the research curriculum.
