Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is pleased to announce the 2017 Summer Internship Program for science students interested in pursuing a Medical Career (MD, MD/PhD, PhD). A total of 15 positions will be available with mentors from CCHMC working in different areas of Pediatrics and clinical research. Please note that this program is **not** for students interested in a Nursing career.

We offer these highly competitive paid internships to qualified applicants based on high school academic and leadership accomplishments. The Internship program begins on Wednesday, June 14th through Tuesday, August 8, 2017. Interns will work part-time (20 hours per week), and will be paid a maximum of \$1,296 (\$8.10/hr). The work schedule is flexible but attendance on Orientation Day, Wednesday June 14<sup>th</sup>, is mandatory for all participants. **PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL APPLICANTS MUST BE GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL IN 2017.**

Students interested in applying for this program must submit a completed application and provide the requested support information. Please note that applications must be received no later than **5pm, on Friday, March 17, 2017**. No FAX's will be accepted and only complete application packets will be considered.
